



Protests are restricted to matters of rule interpretation and player eligibility. The team captain must make any protest involving rule interpretation to the official in charge of the contest at the time the question is raised. If the protest is not registered at this time and play resumes, the protest will not be valid. The official is then responsible for stopping the contest and notifying the Intramural Sports Site Manager at the time of the protest. He/she will record all information on the protest form and play will resume from the point it was stopped. Matters involving an officials judgment are not basis for a protest.

Rule Interpretation

All protests must be made in TYPE-WRITTEN form and submitted to the Intramural Sports Office by the captain of the protesting team between normal Office hours during the next working day following the incident. If the protest is turned in after this time the protest will not be considered.

(EXCEPTION - Playoffs and tournaments. Protests must be filed by 10:00 AM in the Intramural Sports Office the morning following the incident.)





Player Eligibility

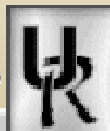
All protests concerning player eligibility must be made by the team captain during the contest, or prior to closing of the Intramural Office during normal hours the first working day following the contest. If done at the game site, the official in charge is responsible for notifying the Intramural Sports Site Manager of the protest. He/she will record all information on the protest form.

(EXCEPTION - Playoffs and tournaments as stated previously.)

An upheld protest (involving rule interpretation only) will result in the game being replayed from the point of the protest.

Upheld player eligibility protests will result in the game being forfeited by the guilty team or individual.
